#### **HEATING INSTRUCTIONS:**

**Convection Oven:** Keep product frozen until ready to cook. Preheat oven to 350°F. Pour contents of 5-pound bag into 2-inch deep hotel pan. Add 1½ cup water and cover pan with foil. Place on the center rack in the oven and cook for 25 minutes. Stir product and replace foil, cook for an additional 25 minutes.

**Conventional Oven:** Keep product frozen until ready to cook. Preheat oven to  $400^{\circ}$ F. Pour contents of 5-pound bag into 2-inch deep hotel pan. Add 1% cup water and cover pan with foil. Place on the center rack in the oven and cook for 30 minutes. Stir product and replace foil, cook for an additional 35 minutes.

#### **SERVING**

Equipment and times may vary. Use thermometer to ensure food temperature is 165°F or above. Reheat to an internal temperature 165°F. #8 scoop size is recommended. Portioning size may vary by individual practice.

## **Buy American Provision**

Section 104(d) of the William F. Goodling Child Nutrition Reauthorization Act of 1998 (Public Law 105-336) added a provision, Section 12(n) to the National School Lunch Act (NSLA) (42 USC 1760(n)), requiring school food authorities (SFAs) to purchase, to the maximum extent practicable, domestic commodities or products. This Buy American provision supports the mission of the Child Nutrition Programs, which is to serve children nutritious meals and support American agriculture. The Buy American provision applies to SFAs located in the 48 contiguous United States and is one of the procurement standards these SFAs must comply with when purchasing commercial food products served in the school meals programs.

Section 12(n) of the NSLA defines "domestic commodity or product" as an agricultural commodity that is produced in the U.S. and a food product that is processed in the U.S. substantially using agricultural commodities produced in the U.S. Report language accompanying the legislation noted that "substantially means over 51% from American products." Therefore, over 51% of the final processed product (by weight or volume) must consist of agricultural commodities that were grown domestically. Thus, for foods that are unprocessed, agricultural commodities must be domestic, and for foods that are processed, they must be processed domestically using domestic agricultural food components that are comprised of over 51% domestically grown items, by weight or volume as determined by the SFA.

For products procured by SFAs for use in the Child Nutrition Programs using nonprofit food service account funds, the product's food component is considered the agricultural commodity. FNS defines food component as one of the food groups which comprises reimbursable meals. The food components are: meats/meat alternates, grains, vegetables, fruits, and fluid milk. Please refer to 7 CFR 210.2 for full definitions. Any product processed by a winning vendor must contain over 51% of the product's food component, by weight or volume, from U.S. origin. This definition of domestic product serves both the needs of schools and American agriculture. Products from Guam, American Samoa, Virgin Islands, Puerto Rico, and the Northern Mariana Islands are considered domestic products under this provision as these products are from the territories of the U.S.

Asian Food Solutions/Comida Vida warrants that its products are produced in the United States and meets the standards under the Federal Buy American Provision and USDA Commodity Processing Guidelines. The following is a list of our items that meet this rule.
