





Superintendent's Letter - January 2018

Dear San Mateo-Foster City Community,

Welcome back from winter break and Happy New Year! We are looking forward to an exciting year ahead with our focus on the success of our students.

SMFCSD Board of Trustees

At the recent California School Boards Association (CSBA) conference that I attended with our Board Members, presenters consistently encouraged Trustees to spend the majority of time available in Board meetings addressing student success. A session titled *Research Based Pathway to Effective Governance* presented six central office and school site actions as being particularly relevant to student achievement: setting a vision and goals with the focus on students, establishing a coherent districtwide system that still offers a degree of autonomy at the school site, using data to inform and support continuous improvement, creating a district culture that supports student achievement including establishing strong community partnerships, investing in staff capacity at all levels, and maintaining stable and effective leadership. They also found that effective Boards set direction, establish structure, provide support, ensure accountability and act as community leaders. On January 20, 2018, at the Board Governance Workshop, the newly formed Board had an opportunity to begin to consider the policies and protocols they will utilize to move the District forward. Along these lines, the Trustees have requested that a **Special Board Meeting be called for February 1, 2018 at 6:00 pm to determine the process that will be**

followed for filling the upcoming Board vacancy.

Governor's Proposed Budget

You may have heard that the Governor's proposed budget has been released. While this budget does support education, California is still ranked at the bottom in relation to other states in the nation. At the next regularly scheduled Board meeting on January 25, 2018, the Board will consider a resolution calling for full and fair funding for California Schools. Additionally, information gathered from Town Halls, our local survey and work with the District's Fiscal Advisory Committee regarding the District's fiscal condition will be presented. I encourage you to join us.

Flu Season Is Here

Winter is here, which also means the cold and flu season is officially upon us. The health and safety of our students and staff is a primary concern in the San Mateo-Foster City School District and in order to keep our students, staff and families healthy, we need your assistance at home.

We encourage you and your family to continue to practice the 3 C's:

- Cover your sneeze with a tissue and cover your cough with the inside of your elbow and not your hands
- *Clean* your hands frequently with soap and water and avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth
- **Contain** germs by staying home and keeping your child home they are sick (A fever >100, coughing, sore throat, body aches, nausea, vomiting etc.)



To keep the flu from spreading, we ask that you keep sick children at home until they are symptom-free for 24 hours. Any children who are sick at school will be sent home. Read More ...

A Parent's Guide to Head Lice

A PARENT'S GUIDE

Easy Steps
to Control
Head Lice

We are seeing increasing numbers of students with lice and nits. Please remember that this is not a health issue so much as a nuisance issue. Please examine your child's head as well as all members of your household. You may use the information below to help identify lice. Anyone can get head lice. They are most common in young school-age children, but teens and adults can have it as well.

What to Look For:

- Nits on the hair shaft - Nits are the eggs which are oval, whitish-gray objects glued to the side of the hair shaft. Nits are most often found near the nape of the neck, behind the ears, and at the crown.

- Lice in the hair - Lice are usually brown but can vary in color. They are the size of a sesame

seed. They move quickly and keep out of the light.

PLEASE REMEMBER: ALL NITS MUST BE REMOVED BEFORE A CHILD RETURNS TO SCHOOL.

ScholarShare529 College Savings Plan & Matching Grant Program



The State of California is offering a College Savings Plan called ScholarShare529 beginning January 1, 2018 for any family with a total gross income of \$75,000 or less. The tax-deferred program was created to assist low to moderate income families "jumpstart" their children's college savings fund. Here are some highlights of the program, though more detailed information is available at the **ScholarShare website**.

Benefits to Families:

- A dollar-for-dollar match in contribution up to \$200 on new accounts.
- A \$25 bonus for establishing a monthly automatic contribution plan of \$25 or more.
- Funds can be used at any accredited higher-education program, including community colleges and trade schools.
- Savings will not impact eligibility for CALWORKS and CalFresh.
- Account owner has total control of where the funds go.
- Account owner can change beneficiary at any time.

To be eligible, parents/guardians must:

- Be California residents at enrollment.
- Have a valid Social Security number or a federal Tax ID number.
- Have an adjusted gross annual income of \$75,000 or less.
