Superintendent's Letter - December 2017

With the holidays rapidly approaching, it is a time to remember what we most appreciate. As I reflect on the first part of the school year, I am thankful for the dedication of our school board, staff, families, and students. Welcome Aboard!

At our December 7th Board Meeting, we welcomed three new Trustees to our Board - Shara Watkins, Noelia Corzo and Rebecca Hitchcock. The Election of Officers was the first order of business during the Annual Board Organization and we are pleased to announce that Nancy Kohn Hsieh will serve as President, Audrey Ng as Vice President and Shara Watkins as Clerk for the upcoming year.

Labor Negotiations Update

I am very happy to report that SMETA and the District reached a Tentative Agreement on November 30th. I would like to thank both negotiating teams on reaching a mutually acceptable agreement on complex issues. We look forward to continuing our work together on behalf of our students. The District and our Classified School Employees Association (CSEA) are now working to complete negotiations.

Fiscal Advisory Committee & Town Hall Meetings on School Finance

A Fiscal Advisory Committee was formed to review and consider options for addressing the District's structural deficit. California ranks 46th in the United States for per-pupil funding and our District falls below the California state average of per-pupil funding. We continue to hear

about the increased funding that the State has provided to school districts over the past couple of years and, while that is true, this funding is only bringing districts back to revenues that were provided during the 2007-2008 school year...10 years ago! This is a problem for districts across our State and particularly for our District which has been chronically underfunded.

As an underfunded District, we need to be efficient in our use of fiscal resources, seek budget enhancements such as partnerships with businesses and our Education Foundation, potentially look at a **parcel tax** as a way to raise revenue and advocate for increased funding for schools throughout the State of California. We have been hosting Town Hall Meetings on School Finance in an effort
