As Thanksgiving approaches, I wish the San Mateo-Foster City School District community a restful time of sharing with family and friends.

At the November 16, 2017 Board Meeting 51 teachers and certificated staff moved from probationary to permanent status. It was exciting to celebrate this milestone in their careers. We also honored outgoing Board Members Chelsea Bonini and Ed Coady for their service and the guidance they have provided the District during their tenure. At our next Board Meeting we will welcome our incoming Board Members: Noelia Corzo, Rebecca Hitchcock and Shara Watkins. We are looking forward to working with our new team!

Community Input Sought at Town Hall Meetings in December Regarding School Finance

We will be holding Town Hall Meetings regarding school finance. As our District is chronically underfunded and currently experiencing a structural deficit caused by increased pension liability, escalating costs of doing business and the loss of the \$7 million in parcel tax funds last year, we are concerned that any proposed cuts will negatively affect outcomes for our students. Raising



revenues would require a new parcel tax. We invite our community to share ideas related to the District's fiscal deficit at our Town Hall meetings.

The idea behind the bench is simple: If a child is sitting on the bench alone, it is a signal to other kids to ask him or her to play.

Meadow Height's wanted a place on the playground to allow students the opportunity to find a friend and meet

new people even if they already have friends. "It really helps build a positive school climate," said Stephanie Fraumeni, Meadow Height's Elementary School principal. "If kids aren't sure what to do or what their options are, they can go hang out there. ... Then other kids can go invite that kid to join them in whatever they are doing."

Bayside Academy Math Festival

More than 200 students and their families gathered at Bayside Academy on a bright Saturday morning in October to tackle fun math challenges and to play games designed to ignite a deeper understanding of mathematics. Bayside Academy hosted two separate Julia Robinson Mathematics Festivals, one for younger students and one for 5th-8th graders on October 28th.

The Julia Robinson Math Festival is a nonprofit organization that has been recognized nationally for its efforts to provide a high quality STEM education. Its mission is to inspire a lifelong curiosity for mathematics by instilling a genuine interest in creative problem-solving from an early age.



Students from all over the Bay Area, including Oakland, San Francisco, Palo Alto and San Jose, came to Bayside to participate. Thirteen SMFC District schools also had students in attendance. Community volunteers, including several high school students, helped to facilitate the math tables. Some students cruised from table to table doing puzzles, problems or games while others spent 30 minutes or more digging deep into one challenge.
