Happy May! As we wind down the school year, we have much to celebrate...

New School in Foster City

On May 10, we took another step forward in the journey to building a new elementary school in Foster City. District officials, through public contracting code, opened bids for the construction of the new school. There were two bidders who responded to the publicly advertised prequalification and bidding announcement, which began earlier this spring.



The bids will be evaluated according to State law based on their responsiveness to the details in the District's request for bids and considered in light of the District's available resources to fund the project. It is anticipated that the District's Board of Trustees will consider the award of bid for the project at either its June 6 or June 20 meeting.

Vision To Learn Donates Eye Exams & Glasses to Students




