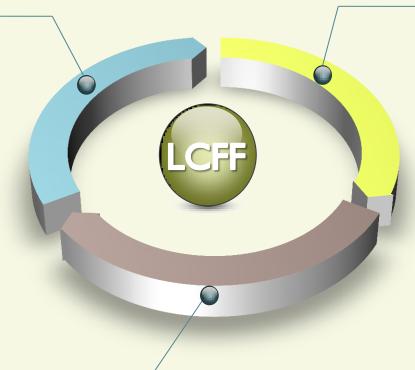


### Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP)

- Local goals focused on improved student outcomes
- Annual spending plan aligned with Goals

### **State Requirements**

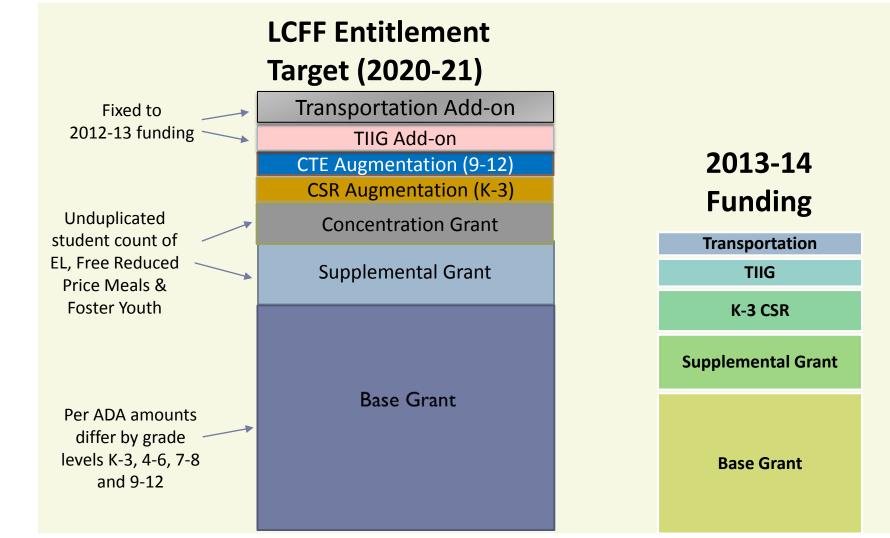
- Performance expectations
- Expenditure requirements
- Proportionality rule
- Annual audit



### County and State Superintendent Oversight

- Technical assistance
- Approval or disapproval of local plans
- Review data on eligible student counts
- Stay and rescind actions of a local governing board

## School Funding Before & After LCFF

Before LCFF	After LCFF	
Revenue Limit differentiated by school district – same amount for all grade levels	LCFF base funding differentiated by grade span – same for all school districts & charter schools	
State categorical programs with temporary tiered flexibility	Targeted supplemental funding based on unduplicated pupil weights	
K-3 class size reduction, 20:1 with funding penalties	K-3 class size reduction, target 24:1 by school	
Accountability and performance process separate from funding	Local Control Accountability Plans required

- Compliance with Williams
- School Accountability Report Cards (SARC)
- Federal funding, planning, and accountability requirements
- Local educational agency as subgrantee of the state

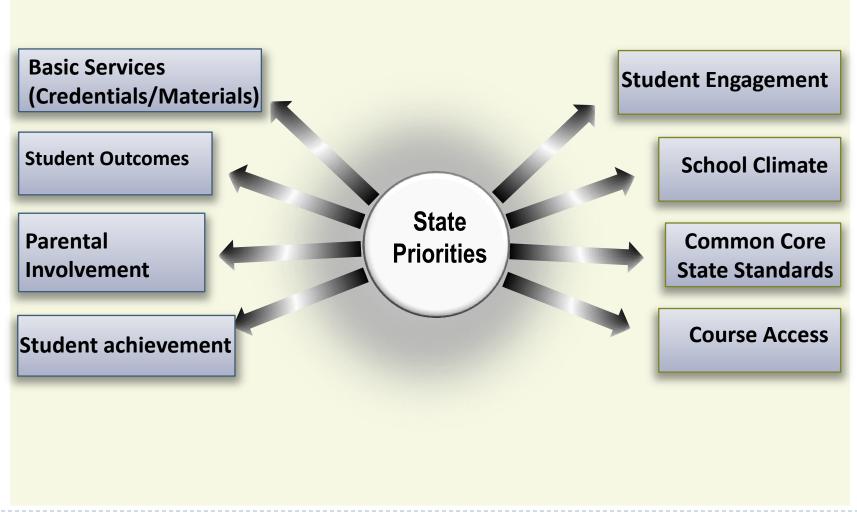

- COE posts LCAP for each district/school or a link to the LCAP

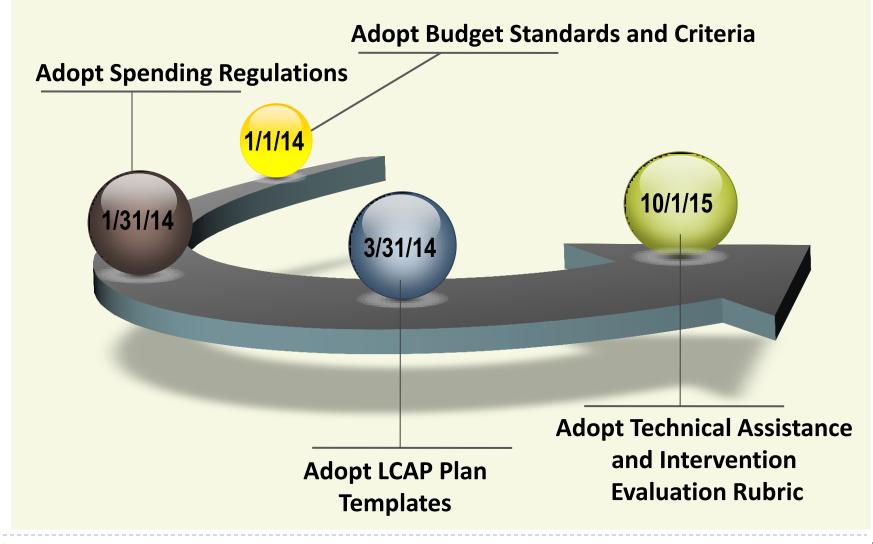

  - Attract, hire and retain quality staff through competitive compensation
  - Staff Development
  - 10% Reserve for Economic Uncertainties
  - Magnet Schools
  - Art, Music and P.E.
  - Instructional Materials & Technology
  - Libraries
  - Keep facilities well maintained
    - Routine Maintenance 3% set aside required
    - Deferred Maintenance Plan

## CCSS Implementation Plan Guiding Principles

- Facilitate high quality professional learning opportunities for educators
- 2. Provide CCSS-aligned instructional resources
- 3. Transition to CCSS-aligned assessment system
- 4. Collaborate with expanded learning communities and programs beyond TK-12





- 5. Collaborate with postsecondary and business communities
- Seek, create and disseminate resources to stakeholders as implementation moves forward
- 7. Design and establish systems of effective communication

### Common Core State Standards (CCSS) Implementation Fund

### One-time Funding

- State appropriated \$1 Billion in 2013-2014 and \$2.5 million in 2014-2015
- \$200 per student
- Must be spent by June 30, 2015
- SMFC School District \$2,291,200
  - Distributed half in August and half in October 2013

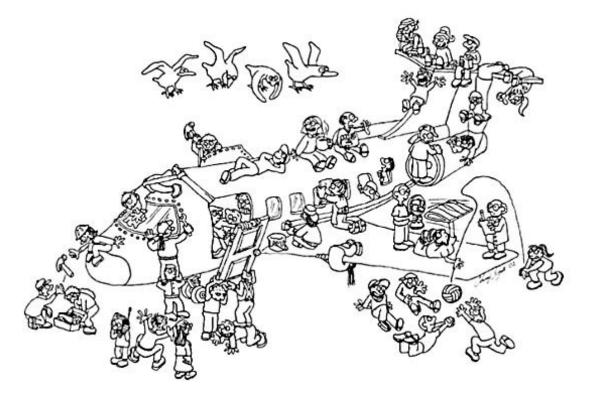


- Professional development to staff who provide direct instruction of pupils
- Instructional materials aligned with CCSS
- Technology-based instruction and Computer-based assessments

## CCSS Implementation Fund District Requirements

- Local Implementation Plan delineating how the CCSS funds will be spent
  - Plan presented at a public board meeting
  - Adopted at a subsequent board meeting
- Detailed report to state on or before July 1, 2015 of expenditures and categories.
  - Number of teachers, administrators, or paraprofessionals receiving professional development
  - Specific purchases

## CCSS Implementation Plan More questions than answers...

•Preparing for a thoughtful plan with many unknown factors:

- How will LCAP impact instructional materials funding? Professional development funding? Funding for technology?
- What data analysis system will provide our district with the most real time data?
- Will other districts be interested in collaborating with SMFC?

## CCSS Implementation Plan and more questions...

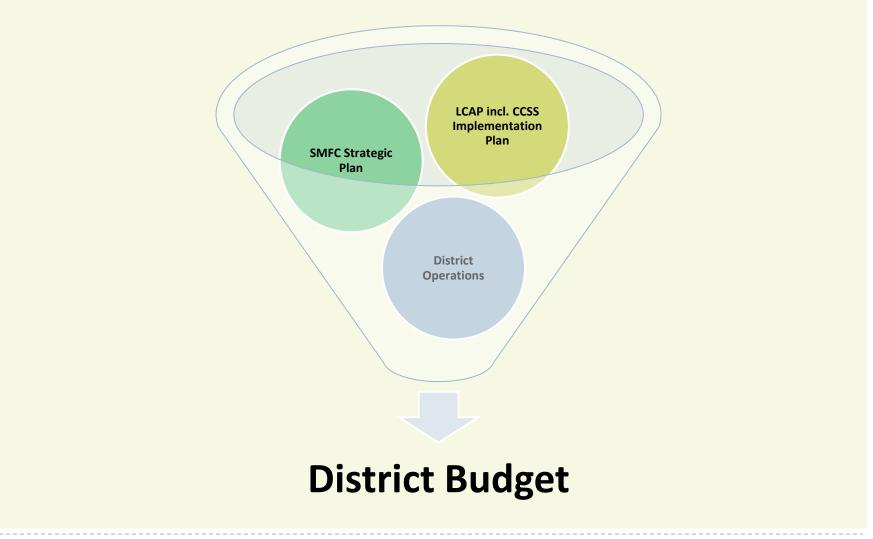
- When will the local adoption of instructional materials be required? How will that impact Williams audits?
